

# INCREASING LANGUAGE



## Support Communication

- Wait Time: Pause after speaking; give child time to respond.
- Respond to Cues: Notice and respond to verbal/non-verbal signals (e.g. pointing, gesturing, grabbing/reaching).
- Celebrate All Communication: Praise any form of communication (words, gestures, sounds).

## Modeling Language

- Self-Talk: Describe what you are doing.
- Parallel-Talk: Describe what your child is doing or what you're doing alongside them.
- Speak from Child's Perspective: "I want the cookie!" instead of "You want the cookie!"



## Expanding Language

- Labeling: Name objects/actions your child is focused on.
- Expand & Extend: Add 1+ words to what your child says. E.g., child: "dog" → you: "big dog!"
- Use Full Sentences: Gradually model more complex language structures.

## Creating Opportunities

- Tempt Communication: Play with toys or use objects that require interaction or that a child needs help to use
- 2-Time Rule: Model action with words twice, then wait.
- Use Prompts: If needed, give sound cue (e.g., "b-" for "ball").
